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SEC. ____ . ACCESSION BONUS FOR MEMBERS APPOINTED AS COMMISSIONED OFFICERS AFTER ATTENDING OFFICER CANDIDATE SCHOOL.

1 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 5 of title 37, United States Code, is amended by adding at the
2 end the following new section:

3 **"§ 331. Special pay: accession bonus for officer candidates**

4 "(a) ACCESSION BONUS AUTHORIZED.—Under regulations prescribed by the Secretary
5 concerned, a person who executes a written agreement to complete officer candidate school,
6 accept a commission or appointment as an officer of the armed forces, and serve on active duty
7 as a commissioned officer for a period specified in the agreement may, upon acceptance of the
8 agreement by the Secretary concerned, be paid an accession bonus in an amount determined by
9 the Secretary.

10 "(b) LIMITATION ON AMOUNT OF BONUS.—The amount of an accession bonus under
11 subsection (a) may not exceed \$8,000.

12 "(c) PAYMENT METHOD.—Upon acceptance of a written agreement under subsection (a)
13 by the Secretary concerned, the total amount of the accession bonus payable under the agreement
14 becomes fixed. The agreement shall specify whether the accession bonus will be paid by the
15 Secretary in a lump sum or installments.

16 "(d) REPAYMENT.—A person who, having received all or part of the bonus under an
17 agreement referred to in subsection (a), does not complete the total period of active duty service
18 as a commissioned officer as specified in the agreement shall be subject to the repayment
19 provisions in section 303a(e) of this title.

20 "(e) AUTHORITY FOR PAYMENT OF BONUS UNDER EARLIER AGREEMENTS.—The Secretary
21 of the Army shall use this authority to retroactively pay a bonus to a person who executed an

1 agreement during the period from April 1, 2005 through April 1, 2006 to enlist for the purpose of
2 attending officer candidate school."

3 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections at the beginning of such chapter is
4 amended by adding at the end the following new item:
5 "330. Special pay: accession bonus for officer candidates."

Section-by-Section Analysis

This section would authorize the payment of a bonus to a person who agrees to complete officer candidate school, accept a commission or appointment as an officer of the armed forces, and serve on active duty as a commissioned officer for a period specified by the Secretary concerned. The Secretary concerned would determine the amount of the bonus, not to exceed \$8,000. A person who does not serve on active duty as a commissioned officer for the period specified would be subject to the repayment provisions applicable to similar bonuses under title 37.

Subsection (e) of new section 331 of title 37, United States Code, would require the Secretary of the Army to use this authority to retroactively pay a bonus to a person who entered into an agreement during the period from April 1, 2005 through April 1, 2006 to attend officer candidate school and receive a bonus, but has not yet received the bonus, notwithstanding the person's completion of the conditions of the agreement. Section 309 of title 37 authorizes an enlistment bonus for persons who serve on active duty for at least two years; this authority is used to enlist persons to serve in critical skills. Subsection (e) of new section 331 would clarify that these earlier agreements to attend officer candidate school and receive a bonus under section 309 are retroactively authorized.

**SEC. ____ . FLEXIBLE FINANCING OF MILITARY HOUSING PRIVATIZATION
INITIATIVE.**

1 Section 2883 of title 10, United States Code, is amended—

2 (1) in subsection (c)—

3 (A) in paragraph (1)(D)—

4 (i) by striking "interest on loans made under section 2873 of this
5 title,";

6 (ii) by striking "and any" and inserting "any"; and

7 (iii) by inserting before the period at the end the following: ", and
8 excluding amounts from any transactions pursuant to loans made under
9 section 2873 of this title"; and

10 (B) in paragraph (2)(D)—

11 (i) by striking "interest on loans made under section 2873 of this
12 title,";

13 (ii) by striking "and any" and inserting "any"; and

14 (iii) by inserting before the period at the end the following: ", and
15 excluding amounts from any transactions pursuant to loans made under
16 section 2873 of this title"; and

17 (2) by adding at the end of subsection (d) the following new paragraph:

18 "(4) Notwithstanding paragraphs (1) and (2), the Secretary of Defense may use
19 amounts credited to the Funds under paragraphs (1)(C), (1)(D), (2)(C), and (2)(D) in
20 subsection (c) without appropriation. The Secretary may use such funds only after—

1 "(A) the end of the 30-day period beginning on the date the Secretary
2 submits written notice of, and justification for, the use of such amounts to the
3 appropriate committees of Congress; or

4 "(B) if earlier, the end of the 14-day period beginning on the date on
5 which a copy of the notice and justification is provided in an electronic medium
6 pursuant to section 480 of this title."

Section-by-Section Analysis

Section 2883(c) of title 10, United States Code, allows funds to be credited to the Department of Defense (DoD) Family Housing Improvement Fund (FHIF), including:

(1) amounts authorized and appropriated to the Fund;

(2) amounts that the Secretary of Defense transfers in such amounts as provided in appropriations Acts to the Fund from amounts appropriated to the DoD for the acquisition or construction of military family housing;

(3) proceed from the conveyance or lease of property or facilities under section 2878 of title 10; and

(4) income and gains realized from investments under section 2875 of title 10.

Section 2883(d) limits the funds that can be expended from the account to such amounts as provided in appropriation acts. This proposed amendment would permit the Military Departments to retain the income and gains received through projects previously executed via the FHIF and spend those funds on future privatization projects without having to have the funds appropriated. To abide by credit reform rules, this amendment would exclude the use of cashflows and transactions associated with loans made under section 2873 of title 10.

5 (c) REENLISTMENT BONUS FOR ACTIVE MEMBERS.—Section 308(g) of such title is
6 amended by striking "December 31, 2007" and inserting "December 31, 2008".

7 (d) ENLISTMENT BONUS.—Section 309(e) of such title is amended by striking "December
8 31, 2007" and inserting "December 31, 2008".

9 (e) RETENTION INCENTIVES FOR MEMBERS QUALIFIED IN CRITICAL MILITARY SKILLS OR
10 ASSIGNED TO HIGH PRIORITY UNITS.—Section 323(i) of such title is amended by striking
11 "December 31, 2007" and inserting "December 31, 2008".

12 (f) ACCESSION BONUS FOR NEW OFFICERS IN CRITICAL SKILLS.—Section 324(g) of such
13 title is amended by striking "December 31, 2007" and inserting "December 31, 2008".

14 (g) INCENTIVE BONUS FOR CONVERSION TO MILITARY OCCUPATIONAL SPECIALTY TO
15 EASE PERSONNEL SHORTAGE.—Section 326(g) of such title is amended by striking "December
16 31, 2007" and inserting "December 31, 2008".

17 (h) ACCESSION BONUS FOR MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES APPOINTED AS
18 COMMISSIONED OFFICERS AFTER COMPLETING OFFICER CANDIDATE SCHOOL.—Section 330(f) of
19 such title is amended by striking "December 31, 2007" and inserting "December 31, 2008".

Section-by-Section Analysis

This section would extend for one year, through December 31, 2008, accession, conversion, and retention bonuses for military personnel possessing or acquiring critical skills or assigned to high priority units, including occupations that are arduous or that feature extremely high training and replacement costs. It also would extend incentive pay for members in designated assignments and the authority for payment of an accession bonus upon commission following completion of officer candidate school. Experience shows that retention of members in critical skills would be unacceptably low without these incentives, which in turn would generate the substantially greater costs associated with recruiting and developing replacements. The Department of Defense and the Congress have long recognized the cost-effectiveness of financial incentives in supporting effective staffing in such critical military skills, assignments, and high priority units.

Cost Implications: There are no additional costs associated with this section. The military departments have already projected expenditures for these incentives in their budget sections.

**SEC. ____ . REVISED AUTHORITY FOR ARMY INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES TO
ENGAGE IN COOPERATIVE ACTIVITIES WITH NON-ARMY
ENTITIES.**

- 1 Section 4544 of title 10, United States Code, is amended—
- 2 (1) in subsection (a), by adding at the end the following new sentence: "The Army
- 3 is authorized not more than eight contracts or cooperative arrangements in total under this
- 4 section."; and
- 5 (2) by striking subsection (k).

Section-by-Section Analysis

Section 4544 of title 10, United States Code, authorizes any working-capital funded Army industrial facility (including an ammunition plant, arsenal, depot, or manufacturing plant) to enter into a contract or cooperative arrangement with a non-Army entity to carry out with the non-Army entity specified military or commercial projects. These projects include the sale of articles manufactured by the facility or services performed by the facility to persons outside the Department of the Army; performance of work by a non-Army entity at the facility; performance of work by the facility for a non-Army entity; sharing of work by the facility and non-Army entity; leasing, or use under a facilities use contract or otherwise, of the facility or equipment of the facility by a non-Army entity; and the preparation and submission of joint offers by the facility and the non-Army entity for competitive procurements entered into with a Federal agency.

Subsection (c) of section 4544 places certain conditions on activities under the section; for example, an activity may not interfere with the performance of work by the facility for the Department of Defense.

The proceeds received from the sale of an article or service pursuant to a contract or cooperative arrangement under the section are credited to the working capital fund that incurs the cost of manufacturing the article or performing the service.

The authority under section 4544 will expire on September 30, 2009. This amendment would eliminate the time restriction. This would enable the Army to enter into long-term partnerships or agreements that are in the best interest of the Government. This also would provide for a more efficient and economical use of Government-owned industrial plants while encouraging the creation and preservation of jobs. In addition, this amendment would limit to

eight the number of contracts or other cooperative arrangements under section 4544.

SEC. ____ . EXPANSION OF AUTHORITY TO EXCHANGE RESERVE COMPONENT FACILITIES.

1 Section 18240(a) of title 10, United States Code is amended by striking "with a State" in
2 the first sentence and inserting "with an executive agency as that term is defined in section 105
3 of title 5, the United States Postal Service, a State".

Section-by-Section Analysis

A number of reserve component facilities are no longer in the ideal location for their military mission due to surrounding land development and encroachment, but are still required by the Army to meet mission requirements. This legislation would authorize the Secretary of Defense to authorize the Secretary of a military department to exchange such non-excess, reserve component real property and facilities for replacement real property and facilities of equal fair market value.

Section 18240 of title 10, United States Code, was enacted in the Ronald W. Reagan National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2005 (Public Law 108-375) as the result of an Army-initiated legislative proposal. Its authority has proven to be an important tool in helping the reserve components obtain new replacement facilities and real property in locations better suited for military operations and training.

As currently drafted, section 18240 authorizes an exchange of non-excess reserve component facilities under the control of that Secretary through "an agreement with a State, local government, local authority, or private entity." The Army and the General Services Administration recently determined that, in its current form, section 18240 does not authorize an exchange of non-excess reserve component facilities with another Federal agency or organization of the Federal government such as the United States Postal Service (USPS). This problem became evident after the USPS expressed interest in acquiring an Army Reserve facility in Boston, Massachusetts specifically under section 18240. While there is other authority under which to exchange excess property between agencies, no other authority exists under which an exchange of these non-excess Department of Defense facilities with Federal agencies and Federal organizations could occur.

Federal agencies should be eligible exchange entities under section 18240. This proposed section would resolve the gap in the underlying authority by authorizing exchanges between military departments and other organizations of the United States Government.
