



CENTCOM Requirements

The priority for Operation Iraqi Freedom stability force contributions remains as follows:

- A division size force to fill the MND-North requirement
 - A division (-) size force to enhance coalition capabilities in central and western Iraq.
 - A brigade or greater sized force to sustain the rotation of forces in Polish / UK led MNDs
 - Combat Service / Combat Service Support (Engineers, Transporters, Military Police, etc.) units to support OIF II force rotation concept



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Post UNSCR -Assessment

The UN resolution by itself is not sufficient to entice any of the following countries to contribute forces to OIF.

Large Contributions – Brigade up to Division

- **Korea** – UNSCR increased public opinion regarding ROK participation from ~30% to ~70%. ROK government announced 18 OCT that it is prepared "in principle" to send additional forces to Iraq to "support the establishment of peace in Iraq and its rapid post-war reconstruction." Exact size, composition, and timing of this dispatch will be determined by a number of factors to include consultations with the US. Survey teams to be dispatched to Washington, Tampa, and Baghdad.
- **Pakistan** – Musharraf wants GC welcome, Muslim support, and possibly other financial incentives (F-16s, stipend).
- **India** - Public comments oppose participation.
- **Turkey** – Has articulated a number of requests, including a "detailed" military MOU, (b)(1) representation in CPA, and a US statement on Political Vision for Iraq
- **Bangladesh** - GOB has stated it will only contribute troops to a "blue-helmet" operation; not clear whether UN mandate is sufficient, or whether UN salaries will still be an issue. (b)(1)

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- **Russia** – Post – UNSCR: Publicly stated "No Troops"
 - **Germany** – Post – UNSCR: Publicly stated "No Troops". May provide police trainers
 - **France** - Post – UNSCR: Publicly stated "No Troops" . May provide police or military trainers.

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Post UNSCR -Assessment

Small or Service Support Contributions – Battalion or Smaller

- **Japan** – Offering C-130's and Water Purification/Transportation/Electric Generation Units.
- **Bosnia** – Offering 1 Transportation Company. Requires funding.
- **Croatia** – Offering a SOF Platoon & Intel section. Pending Parliamentary approval expected Nov/Dec 03.
- **Tonga** – Offering Infantry Plt. Deploy under U.S. command and control. Require equipment & funding.
- **Fiji** – Offering Infantry Battalion. Require equipment and funding (salaries)
- **Nepal** – Potential offer - 1 Infantry Co. and an EOD team
- **Morocco** - Do not have good idea of requirements (and resulting costs), as Morocco has not yet engaged in mil-mil discussions with CENTCOM. Not clear whether UNSCR provides necessary political cover.
- **Greece** - UNSCR will make it possible for Greece to follow through on its limited offer.
- **Austria** - May require "blue-helmet" operation.
- **Argentina** - Even with a UN mandate, Argentina will require U.S. commitment to pay likely significant expenses. There are also GOA political obstacles.
- **Finland** - Likely to only be able to provide small numbers (though high quality) of troops.
- **Paraguay** - Possible offer, but high financial costs and GOP Congressional approval is necessary. UN resolution removes some political hurdles, although Congressional vote will depend on details and support.
- **Sweden** - Senior MFA officials have reported that Sweden would require an adequate UN mandate to contribute troops to Iraq, but even with such a mandate, current Swedish peacekeeping troop commitments are already taxing its capabilities

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


Post UNSCR - Way Ahead

- **Re-address remaining red lines if required**
 - UN salaries
 - Nations previously ruled out (Germany, France, Russia)
