SUBJECT: Meeting of Non-Proliferation Policy PCC

You are invited to attend a meeting of the Non-Proliferation Policy PCC on Friday, September 28 at the Department of State, Room 6510, from 2:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Assistant Secretary Richard A. Clarke will chair the meeting, which will be held at the Top Secret Codeword classification level. Attendance should be at the Assistant Secretary/Deputy Assistant Secretary level.

The agenda will be to conclude PCC discussion of the Enhanced Proliferation Controls Initiative, which was discussed at PCC meetings in July. Documents pertaining to the EPCI topic are attached.

Attendance will be limited to principals plus one. To insure proper clearances are passed, agencies should notify Allen Locke of INR (647-7752) of the name and SSN of their attendees.

Enhanced Proliferation Controls Initiative (EPCI)

This paper summarizes in four packages the enhanced proliferation controls developed in the PCC process.

1. Equipment

This initiative would institute foreign policy controls under section 6 of the Export Administration Act for Proliferation Control. Countries of concern would be listed and an Individual Validated License would be required for the export to those countries of:

- A. Chemical plants and designs for chemical plants
- B. BW related equipment (see warning list attached)

2. End User Related Controls

Under the same Proliferation Control regulations mentioned above, require a IVL for:

A. Anything being exported for ultimate end use by or at a list of proliferation related companies, institutes, and government ministries.

B. Anything which the exporter knows or has reason to know has an end-use related to CBW or missile development or production.

C. Mandate denial for currently-licensed items that are being exported to end-users (companies, institutes and government ministries) engaged in CBW or missile proliferation, or where there is a risk of diversion to such activities.

3. CW Precursors

In order to cover additional countries of concern and to put in place effective controls over transshipment from "clean" countries, extend the current requirement for an IVL for export of core chemicals on the Australia Group to all chemicals on the Australia Group list (i.e. erga omnes controls).

4. US Citizen Activities

Seek legislation in parallel to the recent BW Act, that would make it a criminal act for a US citizen to assist in a CW or missile program abroad without a munitions license.

BW Equipment Proposed for Control:

Biohazard containment equipment:

- BL3 and BL4 micro-biological containment safety cabinets
- air-supplied laboratory protective clothing
- and high efficiency particulate air filters (HEPA filters).

High speed continuous flow centrifuges with BL3 and BL4 containment features.

Large scale-lyophilizers and large-scale freeze dryers.

Highly instrumented, computer controlled, fermentation equipment with a built-in self-sterilization capability.
